Evaluation of the Changing Futures Programme

Last Month, Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) published <u>a third interim report from the</u> <u>Changing Futures evaluation.</u>

The Changing Futures programme is a £77 million initiative running in 15 areas across the country that tests innovative approaches to improving outcomes for people experiencing multiple disadvantage.

The evaluation looks at the impact of the Changing Futures programme – which has been running for two years – on people experiencing multiple disadvantages. It also examines how changes at a wider system level affect the way services operate and delivered, with focus on trauma-informed approaches and how support for people is being joined up.

Identifying, assessing and responding to perpetration of domestic abuse: practice guide for mental health professionals

Cambridge University Press have recently published <u>a new framework for professionals</u> to improve professional practice in identifying and responding to perpetration of domestic abuse by people who have contact with mental health services

The guide, published on 4 October 2024, sets out best practice intended to be integrated into local mental health trust/health board policies on safeguarding, domestic abuse and violence risk management whilst improving:

- understanding of current evidence on the association of domestic abuse perpetration with mental ill health and mental health service use
- appreciation for the role of mental health professionals in the identification, assessment and response to perpetration of domestic abuse
- considerations of the role of mental health interventions in responding to perpetration of domestic abuse in mental health services.

Respect: Nowhere to Turn

<u>Respect</u> have this week shared the <u>preliminary key themes and recommendations</u> from their upcoming report, "Nowhere to Turn: Lessons from Families Affected by Child and Adolescent to Parent Violence and Abuse (CAPVA)".

The full report and its findings will be launched at a national webinar, coming this winter. Keep an eye on Respect's social media for more information as it's announced.




Rape Crisis England & Wales: 'A Real Safe Space' report

Rape Crisis England & Wales have published their new report; <u>'A Real Safe Space'</u>

<u>The report</u> considers current National data, policy and funding and commissioning practice alongside its own service experience and data to show how vital the support for children and young people affected by Child Rape and Sexual Abuse (CRaSA) they offer is.

Concluding that children who have experienced CRaSA still do not have access to universally available, specialist, and survivor-centred support in England and Wales, the report identifies 13 recommendations for Central Government departments, commissioners, and NHS England to introduce and prioritise comprehensive commissioning and resourcing plans – including funding – for specialist services, and the upskilling of statutory and generic services that support CYP.



Women's Aid: (2024) The Price of Safety: The cost of leaving a perpetrator and rebuilding a safe, independent life.

Women's Aid have published a <u>new 'Price of Safety' report</u> that quantifies the cost to those subjected to domestic abuse when fleeing, highlighting the deficit between this and policy in making the case for a sufficient, accessible and safe social security system to support them.

Setting out six (6) recommendations for Government departments <u>the report</u> calls for guaranteed funding for the Flexible Fund for 2025/26 and beyond, and improved pathways to public funds, legal aid, social housing, transport and mental health support.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE CAMPAIGNS?

16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence

- Every year, people across the world come together to celebrate the international <u>16 Days of</u> <u>Activism Against Gender-Based Violence</u> campaign.
- It runs from the 25 November (International Day Against Violence Against Women) to the 10 December (International Human Rights Day).
- It calls for an end to gender-based violence, also commonly known as 'violence against women and girls'*.
- In 2024, the international campaign's theme (via UN Women UK) is 'Take your stand against gender-based violence and show there's **#NoExcuse**'.

White Ribbon Day



- White Ribbon UK is the UK branch of the international White Ribbon movement, working to
 prevent all forms of male violence against women, including domestic abuse, harassment, and
 assault. It does this by raising awareness and engaging with men and boys to prevent violence and
 promote gender equality and diversity through culture change.
- Individuals can make the <u>White Ribbon Promise</u>, 'to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women', and wear their white ribbons to raise awareness and show solidarity. They can also commit to becoming White Ribbon ambassadors or champions, engaging with others and promoting culture change around the topic of violence against women and girls.
- Organisations can become '<u>White Ribbon Accredited</u>', meaning they commit to a range of positive actions to promote culture change within their own organisations and local communities. Many Hertfordshire DA & VAWG Partnership organisations are already White Ribbon Accredited, or working on achieving their accreditation.
- <u>White Ribbon Day</u> takes place on 25 November every year, raising awareness about the work of White Ribbon and the need for male allyship in ending violence against women and girls. 2024's White Ribbon Day theme is *#ltStartsWithMen*, addressing the attitudes and behaviours that contribute to a fear of violence for women in their day-to-day lives.

*<u>'Violence Against Women and Girls'</u> describes a range of harmful or abusive behaviours that disproportionately affect women and girls, including sexual violence, stalking and harassment, domestic abuse, 'honour-based abuse' and 'revenge porn'. They can affect anyone and have traumatic, long-lasting impacts.

Orange the World



'<u>Orange the World</u>' is Part of the UN UNITE Campaign to end violence against women by 2030. It encourages public buildings, spaces, organisations, and individuals to use the colour orange to raise awareness of violence against women and girls. The colour orange represents a brighter future, free from violence.

'Orange the World' is intended for 25 November but encouraged during the whole 16 Days of Activism period (25 November – 10 December).
